# **Explanation of the tables**

### Introduction

The centre for policy related statistics of Statistics Netherlands produced tables with information about local units of enterprises that are classified according to the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC). The information that is presented is the number of local units per SIC/branch and local unit size, with regard to persons employed. This information is derived from the general company register, which contains information about enterprises and their local units. Enterprises can have several local units and these local units can be located in several parts of the country. The information described above is given for the years 2007-2017 and is based on the local units that were active on 1 January of that year.

## About the tables

Table 1 presents the number of local units per sector and size in the Netherlands for the years 2007-2017. The size of the local units is based on the number of persons employed within the local unit. There are four size classes distinguished;

- 0-9 persons employed.
- 10-49 persons employed.
- 50-249 persons employed.
- 250 or more persons employed.

There are 18 sectors, based on the SIC classification, presented in the tables;

- 101 Slaughterhouses and processing of meat.
- 107 Manufacture of bakery, pastry and farinaceous products.
- 4722 Shops selling meat and meat products, game and poultry.
- 4724 Shops selling bread, pastry, chocolate and sugar confectionery.
- 551 Hotels and similar accommodation.
- 552 Renting of holiday bungalows and apartments; youth hostels and tourist camps.
- 553 Camping sites.
- 559 Other provision of lodgings n.e.c.
- 561 Restaurants.
- 5621 Event catering.
- 5629 Canteens and industrial catering.
- 563 Bars.
- 861 Hospitals including mental health and substance abuse hospitals.
- 871 Residential nursing care.
- 873 Residential and day care for the disabled and elderly.
- 879 Social assistance with residential care to children and other persons (no elderly and disabled).
- 8891 Child day-care centres.
- 8899 Social work and counselling, community activities.

Table 2 presents the number of local units per branch and size for the COROPplus areas for the years 2007-2017.

To prevent disclosure of information about individual local units, the numbers in the tables are rounded to the nearest multiple of 5.
