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Definitions

Hourly wage	The wage, calculated by dividing the monthly wage in December, excluding overtime, by 1/12 of the annual working hours.
Monthly wage	The monthly wage is the gross wage paid each month, before deducting the pension and early retirement premiums paid by the employee, excluding overtime and special payments (holiday payments, bonuses and dividends).
Gross annual wage	The sum of gross wages, the annual wage applicable for social insurance schemes, employee contributions to pension, early retirement schemes and employee savings schemes, including special payments (holiday payments,
Occupations	<p>The list of occupations that is used in this publication is the Standard Classification of Occupations of 1992 (SBC-92). The SBC-92 is based on the education level, the type of skills that the occupation requires and a combination of the principal directions (maximum of 3) of occupations. Statistics Netherlands uses the SBC to classify occupations in vacancies.</p> <p>The SBC distinguishes 1211 occupations, which are divided into 43 occupation classes and 121 occupation groups. These custom tables provide information on the gross annual and hourly wages on the level of occupation classes and groups. To determine which 5-digit SBC classifications belong to these occupation classes (2-digit) and groups (3-digit), the SBC-92 classification list is provided as an appendix (in Dutch).</p>

Explanation of the data source

Source

Wage Structure Survey (LSO)

The results are based on the Wage Structure Survey (LSO) and refer to jobs of employees living in the Netherlands in the age category 15-64. The LSO combines data from three sources: the municipal population registers (GBA), the Employment and Earnings Survey (EES) and the Labour Force Survey (EBB). The results refer to jobs at the end of the year 2002.

Remarks

Because the LSO is based on sample surveys, the results have to be weighted to be representative for the total population. The LSO contains roughly 83 thousand employment records. The weights are calculated to ensure that the weighted population is consistent with the total number of persons of 15-64 years in the Netherlands in 2002, excluding the institutional population. These weights also partly correct for selective non-response.

As in every sample survey, the results are subject to a margin of error. Therefore, weighted totals based on 50 observations or fewer (equalling weighted totals around 2,5 thousand) are not published. The absolute totals in the tables are rounded off to the nearest thousand.
