1999: economic growth 3.5%

1999 was another good year for the Dutch economy, with economic growth at 3.5%, nearly as high as in 1998. This is the fourth year in succession that economic growth has topped 3%. The last time this happened was in the early seventies. The growth rate accelerated in the course of the year, to reach 4.3% in the fourth quarter, according to provisional estimates of Statistics Netherlands.

## Consumer spending: strong growth but levelling off

Again household spending was an important factor in economic growth, especially in the first half of the year. Consumers spent 3.8% more than in the previous year. In the course of 1999 the growth slowed down, especially in spending on durable goods.

The volume of capital formation was 5.8% higher than in 1998, lifting this growth rate to over 5% for the fourth year in a row.

## Export growth accelerated in the course of the year

The increase in exports was lower than in the two preceding years, at 4.7%. In the first half of the year the increase was particularly sluggish. In the second half of the year it receovered, however, to reach 7.1% in the fourth quarter. The growth was particularly spectacular for exports of agricultural and manufacterd products.

With a 5.3% rise, imports rose more quickly than exports last year, just as they did in 1998. Imports of chemical products metal products and machinery inceased in the course of the year.

## Recovery for goods manufacturers

The acceleration of the increase in exports contributed substantially to the recovery of the manufacturing industry. In 1999 the increase was 2.7%, compared with 1.1% in the previous year. In the first quarter growth was only 0.7%, mainly because of

Statistics Netherlands is a department of the Ministry of Economic Affairs problems in the manufacturing industry, which depends on exports for half of its sales. In the course of the year growth for manufacturers rose, to 4.4% in the fourth quarter.

## Commercial services continue strong growth

With a growth rate of 4.6% commercial services is again the fastest growing branch of industry. However, the growth rate was down on the 5.5% in 1998. The volume increase was lower for the post and telecommunication companies and for business services in particular.
