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Fall in unemployment coming to a standstill

Registered unemployment in the Netherlands was 195 thousand in the months March to May. The latest figures form Statistics Netherlands seem to indicate that the decrease in the unemployment rate seems to be coming to a standstill.

Unemployment in March to May

In the months March to May this year, the number of registered unemployed people in the Netherlands was 195 thousand, six thousand fewer than in February to April. However, seasonal effects usually cause a decrease of over fifteen thousand at this time of year. Once these effects have been removed, the new figure is ten thousand higher than in the previous three-month period. As unemployment figures are based on a sample survey, they are subject to a certain margin of error. Therefore the trend in unemployment is best considered in a longer term perspective.

Fall coming to a standstill

Unemployment has been falling continuously since 1994. At that time just over 520 thousand people were registered as unemployed in the Netherlands. The decline started off gradually but picked up speed from the beginning of 1997. After the summer of 1998, the decrease subsided to around five thousand people a month and this rate was fairly constant up to the end of last year.

The unemployment rates have been more unpredictable in recent months. Compared with six months ago, unemployment is only four thousand lower, and compared with three months ago it is even higher. Because of the margin of error this does not necessarily mean that unmployement is rising. However, it can be concluded that the fall is stagnating.

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
