## Slowdown in industrial production

According to the latest preliminary figures by Statistics Netherlands Dutch industrial production in April 2002 was down 5.6% on April 2001. This means that production slowed down more than in the first quarter, when production was down by 3.6% on a year ago. When the figure was adjusted for seasonal influences it turned out that production in April was also down on March. Production decreased most in the metal industry.

### Greatest decrease in production among consumer goods

The decrease in production in April was greater than in the first three months of 2002. Industrial production is following the developments in producer confidence in the manufacturing industry. Producer confidence had been improving gradually since December 2001 up until March. In April producer confidence fell slightly. This worsening was mainly observed in the consumer goods industry. The production data also show a slowdown in the consumer goods industry, which mainly operates on the domestic market. The continuous decrease in production can be attributed mainly to domestic developments. The international markets is starting to show relatively better results.

## Production down by most in the metal industry

In April production decreased most in the metal industry, as had been the case in previous months. Dutch production in April was down over 10% on last year's level. The metal industry accounts for about a third of total industrial production. In the oil, chemical and rubber industry production was actually 1.5% higher in April this year than a year ago. This branch has a share of around 20% in total industrial production. All other branches of industry saw production go down in April as compared to a year ago. In the wood, construction materials, furniture and other industries the 6.7% decrease may have been negatively influenced by a strike in construction in April.
