International trade up 6 percent

According to provisional figures from Statistics Netherlands, the value of both imports and exports of goods to and from the Netherlands rose by 6 percent in January 2003 compared with twelve months previously. Exports were worth nearly 20 billion euro and imports just over 17 billion euro. This is the fifth month in a row that exports have risen. The value increase was largely the result of higher prices. Overall in 2002 exports fell by 3 percent and imports by 6 percent. The trade surplus in January 2003 amounted to 2.4 billion euro.

Increased trade with EU countries

The Netherlands exported more than 15 billion euro worth of goods to EU countries in January 2003, 4 percent more than in the same month last year. Imports from EU countries amounted to nearly 10 billion euro in January, 5 percent more than a year previously. In 2002 exports fell by 5 percent and imports by 3 percent. The trade surplus with EU countries in January 2003 was 5.5 billion euro.

Substantial rise in exports outside the EU

Exports to non-EU countries rose by 15 percent compared with January last year, to nearly 5 billion euro. Imports rose by 7 percent to nearly 8 billion euro, putting a stop to a series of sixteen consecutive months of decrease. The trade deficit with countries outside the EU was 3.1 billion euro.
