Introduction

In spite of the rapid growth of the number of children in migrant families in rich countries – children who migrated with their parents or were born to immigrants – only limited information is available on the circumstances of these children. Accordingly a specific, multi-country investigation coordinated by UNICEF IRC has been proposed to fill this gap. The information to be obtained will include data from topic-specific monitoring of migrant children, particularly with respect to participation in education and use of health services, and in child protection relevant situations.

One of the countries studied is the Netherlands. The Netherlands Interdisciplinary Demographic Institute (NIDI) will conduct the study, and requested the Statistics Netherlands' Centre of Policy Related Statistics to provide the statistical information. This information consists of six tables about children (0-17 years) in migrant families, their household situation, mobility, parents' educational levels and parents' weekly working hours.

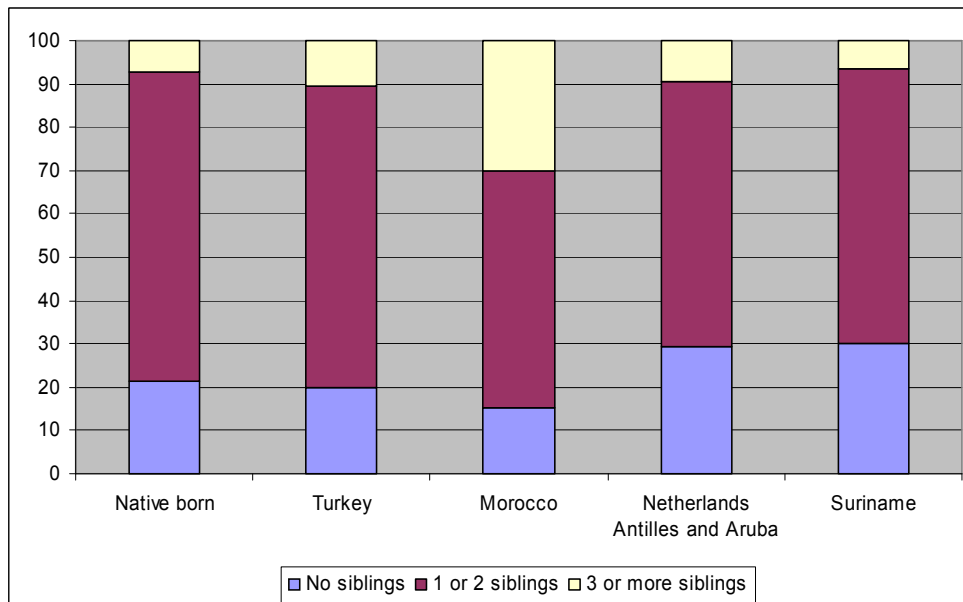
Results

On 1 January 2006, 3,6 million children aged 0-17 years lived in the Netherlands. This is 22 percent of the total population. For 78 percent of these children, both their parents were born in the Netherlands. The remaining 22 percent were children with a foreign background; most of them (84 percent) were second generation children, i.e. they were born in the Netherlands, but one or both of their parents were born elsewhere.

Almost 90 percent of native Dutch children lived in a two-parent family, 10 percent lived in a family with one parent. Relatively more children in immigrant households lived in broken families (23 percent), with the percentages depending on the country of origin. For instance, half of children with an Antillean background lived in a single-parent family, compared with 42 percent of children with a Surinamese background.

Children in immigrant families, are more likely to have either no siblings at all, or a large number of them than native children. Only children account for 21 percent of native Dutch children, while only 7 percent of them had three or more brothers and sisters. For children in immigrant families, 25 percent were an only child and 12 percent lived with three or more siblings. Figure 1 illustrates the differences in numbers of siblings for children of the four main countries of origin in the Netherlands. Children living in large families often had a Moroccan background, while children with parents from Suriname and the Antilles were more likely to be an only child.

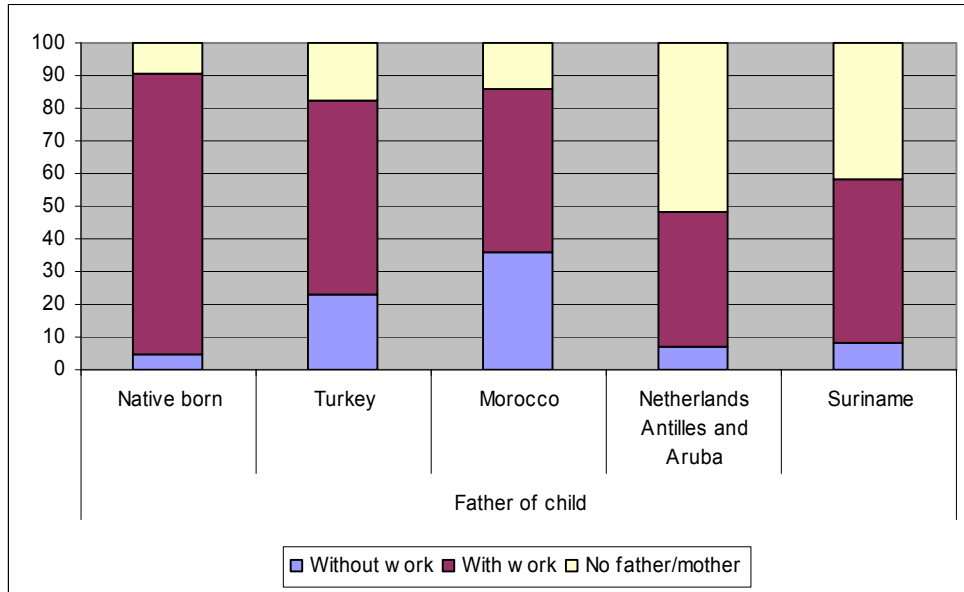
1. Number of siblings of the child in the household, 1-1-2006



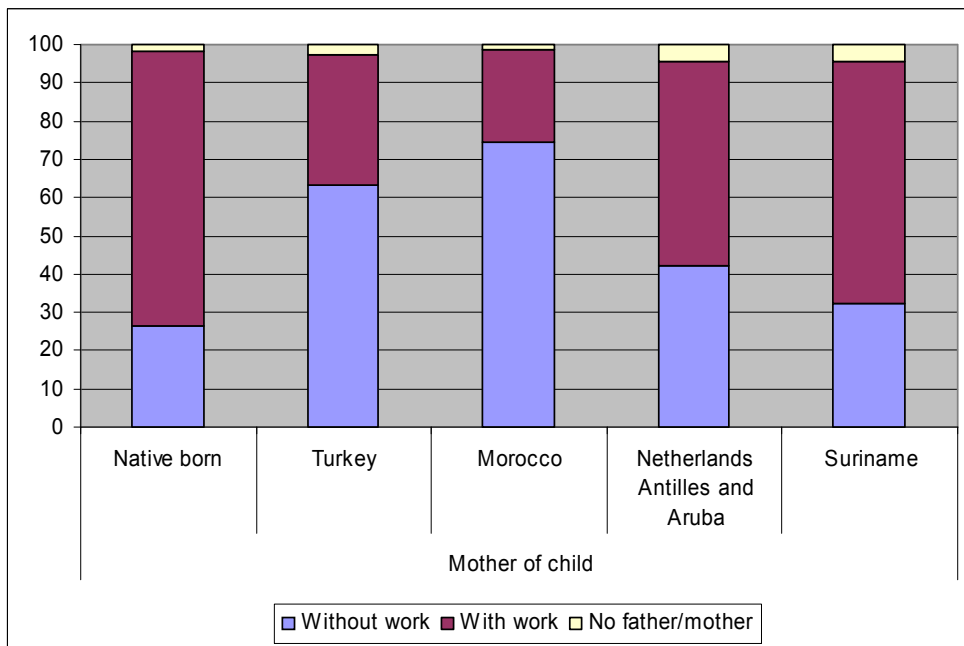
Children with a foreign background more often have parents without work than native children. About one in twenty native children had an unemployed father, compared with one in four first generation and almost one in five second generation foreign children. About a quarter of native children had a mother without work, compared with nearly 60 percent of foreign children of the first generation and half of the second generation.

Figures 2 and 3 show the differences in parental labour market situation between the four major ethnic groups. Children with a Turkish or Moroccan background clearly more often have parents without work than Surinamese and Antillean children. This is true for both fathers and mothers.

Methods and data sources

Target population

The target population consists of all children under the age of 18 living in the Netherlands on 1 January 2006, excluding those living in homes and institutions (institutional population). In some tables specific attention is given to the parents of these children.

Method

Various data sources were combined to compute the results. The main data source is the Longitudinal Municipal Population Register (MPR-L) which contains information on all persons registered in a municipality in the Netherlands.

Additional information was taken from:

- the Labour Force Survey (LFS): on parents' educational level;
- Social Statistics Database (SSD): on parents' labour market position;
- Employment and earnings survey (EES): on weekly working hours of parents.

The LFS, SSD and EES are linked on a person-by-person basis to the MPR-L for the survey date.

Data sources

MPR-L 1995-2006

The Municipal Population Register is a computerised population register used by all municipalities in the Netherlands to record vital events and migration. It was introduced on 1 October 1994. In principle, all persons living in a municipality are registered in the MPR. The register includes information on date of birth, gender, country of birth, address, household composition, immigration and emigration. The MPR-L is a longitudinal register, composed of all entries from 1 January 1995.

LFS 2004, 2005, 2006

The LFS is a continuous sample-based survey of the population aged 15 years and older resident in the Netherlands, excluding persons living in homes and institutions. The survey collects data from some 120 thousand respondents every year. This is the equivalent of 0.8 percent of the target population. The LFS includes questions on prior and present education, employment situation and household characteristics. In the present study the LFS was used to determine the parents' education level.

To reduce the margin of error, a three-year average was calculated using the LFS results for 2004, 2005 and 2006.

SSD 2005

Statistics Netherlands' SSD combines data from a large number of sources. It contains integrated and consistent information on individual persons, originating

from registers and surveys. We used four different datasets from the SSD, namely SSD-jobs, SSD-self-employed, SSD-work abroad and SSD-other work.

SSD-jobs contains information about all jobs in the Netherlands. The main source for this information is the Employee Insurance Schemes Registration System (EIS-Employees), which contains information about social insurances of employees. Additional information is taken from the FIBASE register which contains tax information and the Employment and Earnings Survey (EES), a large scale survey containing information about jobs and wages

The datasets SSD-self-employed, SSD-work abroad and SSD-other work contain data per person on income from, among other things, own business, wages from work done abroad, and wages from other sources.

EES 2005

The Employment and Earnings Survey is a large scale survey containing information about jobs, working hours and wages. Information is collected at employee level and at organisational level. The target population in this survey is all jobs in the Netherlands on 31 December 2005.

Weighting and quality

Weighting the data

Tables 1,2 and 3 are based on the MPR-L. As this is a registration, no weighting procedure was necessary.

Table 4 contains information from the LFS on the education level of the parents. The LFS is a sample survey. To compute results that are representative for the entire target population, the totals must be weighted. For the LFS weights have been calculated that ensure that the weighted population is representative for the total number population aged 15 years and older in the Netherlands, excluding the institutional population. These weights also partly correct for selective non-response. After weighting there was still a small difference in the number of children (0-17 years) by country of origin between the LFS and MPR-L. Therefore a model was constructed to correct the LFS weights so that the number of children and the number of children per continent of origin and generation were consistent with the number of children based on the MPR-L.

Table 5 is based mainly on registration data from de SSD. As the SSD does not contain information on weekly working hours, the EES was used to calculate the hours worked by parents. As the EES, too, is a sample survey, to compute results that are representative for the entire target population, the totals must be weighted by the EES weights. As the SSD datasets used focus on jobs, most of them do not include children. To compute the hours worked by the parents of a child, the child's records were weighted by the EES weight of the parent. The categories of hours worked per week only is shown in term of percentages, based on the EES.

Quality of the results

In tables 4 and 5 data from samples are used. As in every sample survey, these results are subject to a margin of error. Therefore, weighted totals based on 100 observations or fewer are not published in table 5. This only applies to the division into parents' working hours. The other totals in table 5 are based on registration data. The absolute totals in the tables are rounded off to the nearest ten.

Definitions and operationalisation

This section presents the definitions used in computing the tables, and how they were operationalised.

Child in an immigrant family - A person under the age of 18 years of whom at least one parent was born abroad. In the study a distinction is made between children with a first generation foreign background and children with a second generation foreign background. Children with a *first generation* foreign background were born abroad and have at least one parent who was also born abroad. Children with a *second generation* foreign background were born in the Netherlands and have at least one parent who was born abroad.

Child in a native Dutch family - A person whose parents were both born in the Netherlands.

Educational level – This is based on the highest level completed according to the Dutch Standard Classification of Education (SOI) 2003. This study distinguishes three levels of completed education: lower secondary education or lower level, higher secondary education, and tertiary education.

Employee – A person working under an employment contract. In this study people with a record in the SSD-jobs, SSD-work abroad or SSD-other work were count as employees.

Move – Change of country or change of address within the Netherlands, with the exception of changes that are the result of a change in street names, house numbers, municipal boundaries etc.

Origin – The country with which someone is closely related, given their own country of birth and that of their parents.

The origin of a child born abroad is his/her country of birth.

The origin of a child born in the Netherlands of whom one or both parents were born abroad depends on the country of birth of his/her mother and father. If both parents were born in the same country, then that is the origin of the child. If the mother and father were born in different countries, and the mother was not born in the Netherlands, then the origin of the child is the mother's country of birth. If the mother was born in the Netherlands and father was born abroad, the origin of the child is the father's country of birth.
